My Supported Employment Coordinator, Dan, helped me write a resume, purchase interview clothes, fill out applications, get psychologically ready for interviews, prepare for interview questions, meet potential employers, and become employed again.

I work for McDonald's. I operate the grill and the fryers, make sandwiches, do food preparation, cleaning, and help co-workers. I currently work nights and perform the closing duties.

What has changed since I started working is I've got my own apartment and money now. I'm starting to transition. I've started living almost full-time as a woman and I'm getting out of the apartment a lot.

Some of the things I like most about my job are getting out of my apartment, socializing with co-workers and customers, helping to fulfill the needs and wants of our customers and getting a paycheck.

I would like to get a better job and eventually start a career. I am thinking about possibly going to college to better myself and my living situation and get better housing.
